ORANGE COUNTY VISITOR CENTER TO TEMPORARILY CLOSE JANUARY 8-31, 2021

Orange County, VA – The Orange County Visitor Center located at the historic Train Depot at 122 East Main Street, Orange, Virginia, will be temporarily closed the month of January 2021.

The Visitor Center is staffed by volunteers seven (7) days a week. In order to keep our volunteers safe in the current regional COVID-19 environment, the Tourism Department is temporarily closing the Visitor Center beginning Friday, January 8th through January 31st, and will reevaluate opening in February.
